Risk Factors

Risk factors increase the likelihood young people will develop health and social problems

Protective Factors

Protective factors help buffer young people with high levels of risk factors from developing health and social problems

Belive there is no risk to trying marijuana once or twice - 27%

Belonged to a group (gang crew, etc) - 10%

Been expelled from school for drugs - 5%



69% - Are satisfied with themselves

68%- Rated their mental or emotional health as good or better

28% - Students chose to be drug-free based on personal choice

Friends were the main source of alcohol - 25%

First smoke of marijuana came from a friend - 18%

Friends were the main source of cigarettes - 13%



18% - Friends had an influence on students decision to remain drug free

Family member has alcohol or drug problem - 49%

Family members often yell or insult each other - 38%

Family member has sold drugs - 23%



73% of students do activities with their families

70% - When not at home parents/caregivers know who student is with and where

68% - Rules about alcohol, cigarettes and other drugs in family are clear

Believes the penalities/consequences for drug use in school does not stop persons from using/buying/selling drugs - 73%

Know someone at school they can buy marijuana from - 47%

Do not like school - 16%



82% - Like school to some degree or more

71% - Feel like they are a part of their school

53% - Have been taught about alcohol, tobacco and other drugs in school

Have seen drugs being used in their community - 47%

Know where to get drugs in their community - 37%

Have been approached by a stranger to buy or try drugs - 12%



74% - Feel safe in their community / neighborhood / district

50% - Has an adult outside of school they can go to for help with a personal probelm

41% - Has an adult outside of school they can share their thoughts and feelings with
