# Educator's Guide

*Engage students in active storytelling by having them perform simple movements based on keywords in the story. This promotes listening skills, creativity, and physical activity.*

## Materials:

- Projector/Smartboard to display the story
- Open space for movement

## How to Play:

- Introduce the Story: Explain the story title and theme.
- Example: "Pack your safari hats! We're going on the wildest safari ever!"

## Demonstrate the Actions:

- Quickly show the key movements for the story (e.g., wiggle, stomp, jump).
- Example: "When I say Roar like a lion – Let out the biggest lion roar"

## Read the Story:

- Display the story on device, emphasizing the action words.
- Pause to let students do the action (e.g., "pounce like a tiger ready to play").

## Encourage Participation:

*Cheer students on and make the story come alive with enthusiasm and sound effects.*

## Tips:

- Keep it high-energy and fun!
- Adapt movements for different age groups.
- Use teamwork by having students act together.

## Wrap-Up:

*At the end, do all the movements one more time for fun.*

# **KEYWORDS: ROAR, POUNCE, SLITHER, SCRATCH**

**ROAR** – LET OUT A BIG LION ROAR

**POUNCE** – POUNCE LIKE A TIGER READY TO PLAY

**SLITHER** – SLITHER LIKE A SNEAKY SNAKE

**SCRATCH** – SCRATCH THE AIR LIKE A MISCHIEVOUS MONKEY

# STORY TIME

Welcome to the Super Silly Safari, where the animals do the craziest things! First, there's Roary the Lion, but instead of being serious, he loves to **roar (students roar)** like a kitten trying to be loud. Then we have Bouncy the Tiger who loves to **pounce (students pounce)**, but instead of hunting, he pounces into a pile of marshmallows! Next, along comes Sneaky the Snake, who doesn't just slither in the grass—he **slithers (students slither)** while wearing roller skates! And finally, here comes Coco the Monkey, who loves to **scratch (students scratch)** his head while trying to figure out how to eat a banana upside down. The animals are so silly, the zookeeper can't stop laughing!
